Our 105 year old Parish is one of the oldest Orthodox Churches in the United States.

In 1903, Patriarch (Saint) Tikhon of Moscow visited and consecrated our Temple.

He brought a Gramota from the Russian Holy Synod and returned to visit us in 1904 and 1905.

He blessed us to be a multi ethnic parish to minister to all of the Orthodox Nationalities in Denver.

From that time till 1965 we were called "The Russian-Serbian Church of the Transfiguration."

In 1970 we became an English Language Parish.

In 1995, His Hoiness, Patriarch Alexi of Moscow asked us to help the Russian, Ukrainian, Serbian and Bulgarian people who were arriving in America.

In response to his request, we began to serve monthly Divine Liturgy in Slavonic and to serve an annual Liturgy of 7 January in honor of our Slavic Brethren who celebrate the Lord's Nativity on that day.
